We were joined by renowned publishing partners El Nopal Press, Tamarind Institute, Gemini Gel, and Modern Multiples. Our Keynote speaker was Alison Saar, a Los Angeles based sculptor, mixed-media, and installation artist.

Our inaugural Paper Fashion Gala was a huge success! Self Help Graphics & Art (SHG) celebrated 46 years of nurturing innovation and creativity in our printmaking community with a Paper Fashion Gala & Runway Show on May 3, 2019. 
S.O.Y. ARTISTA
