## What is happening at Self Help Graphics?

Self Help Graphics & Art will embark on its building renovation! We're so excited to improve our community's creative home, a 112+ year-old building, and ensure the best possible experience for all.

To support this change, our team will be working temporarily off-site and our 1300 E. 1st St. building will be closed to the public starting April 17, 2023.

### Who is leading the work?

Our renovation project is being managed by <u>TELACU Construction Management</u>, and our building architects are <u>NAC</u>,

### Will subcontractors be hired for the renovation?

### When will construction begin and how long will it take?

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in spring of 2023. The renovation is scheduled to take 18 - 24 months.

### Can the public still purchase prints, catalogues and gifts?

### Will the Professional Printmaking program be affected?

No. Our Professional Printmaking Program will continue to produce works at our temporarily off site location with Master Printer, Dewey Tafoya. This program remains by invitation.

### Will Open Printmaking Studio hours be available during construction?

No. SHG will be closed to the public for the duration of construction until further notice.

#### Will the gallery be open during construction?

No. Self Help Graphics will be closed to the public for the duration of construction. We look forward to sharing this journey with you!
